

KEUTERVILLE WOMAN NAMED ICCW WOMAN OF THE YEAR 1985

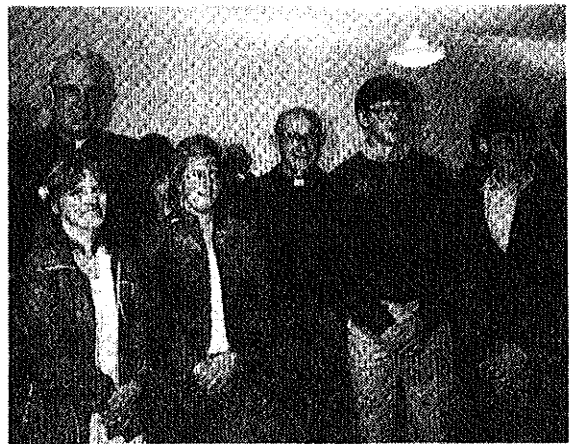

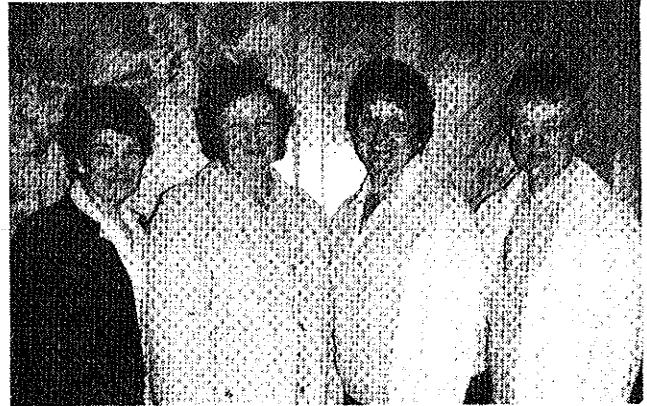

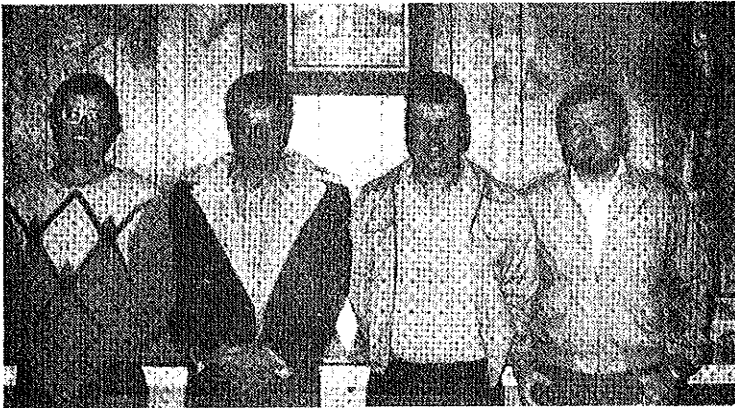
Parish Trustees are Robert Gehring and James Laurino, M.D.



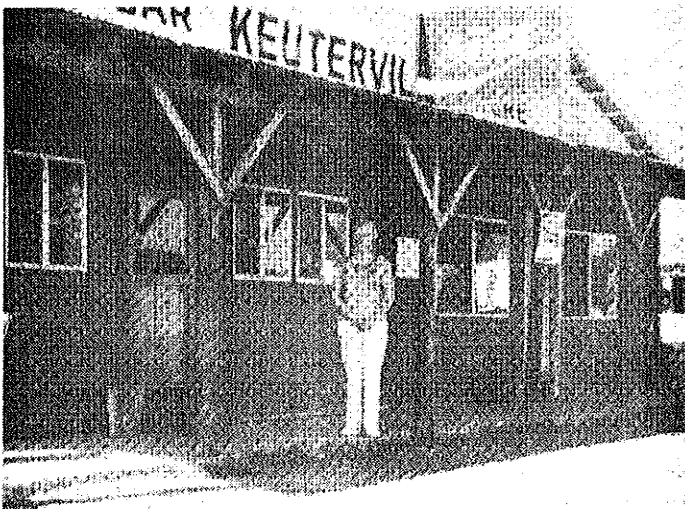

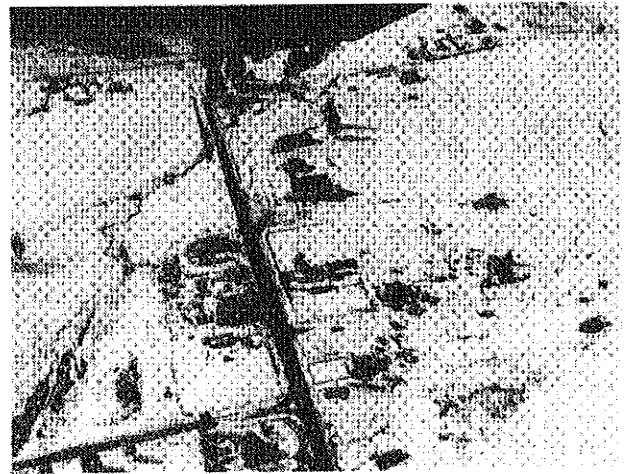

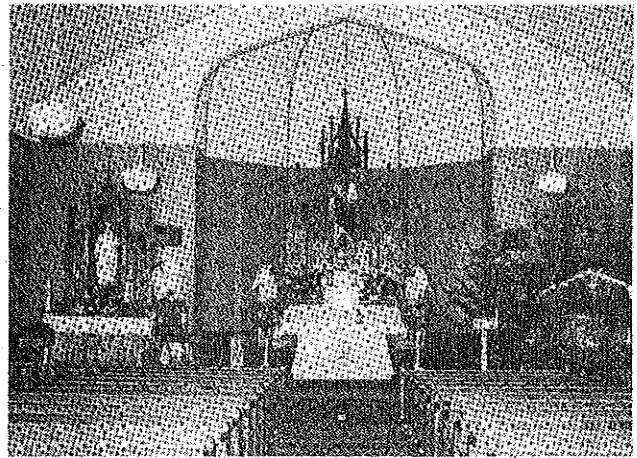
Nellie Poxleitner, the friendly proprietor of the post office, bar, store, and coffee bar in Keuterville.



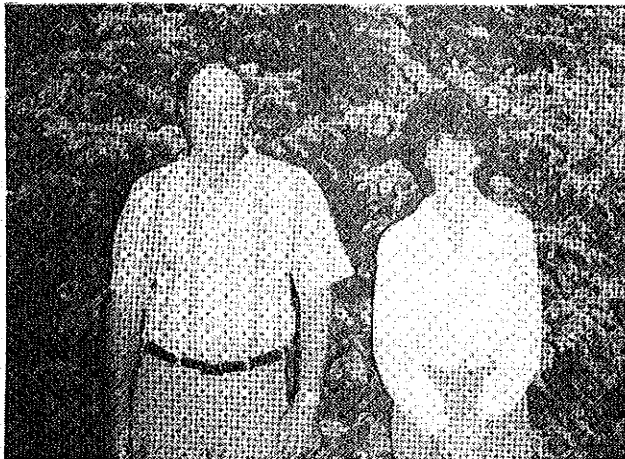
Not many of us will see Keuterville from this angle. The picture was taken in February 1984 by Randy Lorentz.

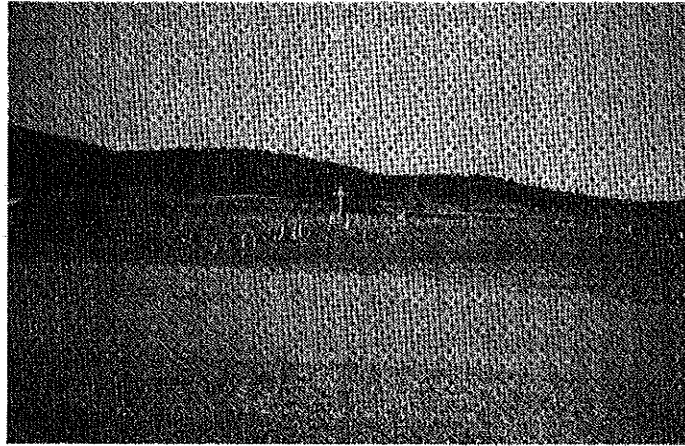

The cemetery ground was donated by Barney Luchtefeld. Mrs. Frank (Mary) Romain was the first person to be buried in 1888. The first funeral listed in the parish book was Mary Elizabeth Sonnen, infant born November 11, 1892, died December 10, 1892 with Rev. Wm. Kroeger officiating, who also lies in this cemetery. The last funeral was for Matilda Schacher on January 31, 1986. First marriage listed in the parish book was on September 12, 1889 joining Helena Coleman to Joannes Dumec with Rev. P.A. Soer, S.J. tying the knot. The last marriage was James Zenner and Kimberly Forsman on October 19, 1985. First Baptism was for Lawrence Peter Duiber on January 22, 1889, the parents are Maria (Helm) and Carol Duiber, Sponsors Michael and Adele Behen, Rev. Soer the priest. Last baptism was Rhonda Nuttman on May 4, 1986, the daughter of Mary (Seubert) and the late Ron Nuttman, Rev. Tony Jahner, S.J. officiating. There are 767 baptisms listed in the book. The last adult convert is Mrs. Patrick (Lannette Gonzales) Enneking. As the book goes to press, in June 1986, the last child born to Keuterville parents is Jessica Enneking, daughter of Pat and Lannette Enneking.
